



### **How to Participate**

Participating is easy, fun to do alone, or with others, and can be done anywhere you find birds.

### Choose the easiest way for you to share your birds:

- · Identify birds with Merlin Bird ID app and add sightings to your list
- . Use the eBird Mobile app
- Enter your bird list on the eBird website (Desktop/laptop)

All you need is a free Cornell Lab account to participate. This account is shared with Merlin, eBird, Project FeederWatch and other projects at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. If you already have an account please use the same username and








We recommend observing birds for at least fifteen minutes. See this page for more counting instructions.


### Important!


- Create an account if you are new to the Great Backyard Bird Count or have not participated since before 2013.
